

2YC₃ Executive Committee Meeting Westchester Community College Thursday, April 11, 1986, 7:00 PM

Present: Jay Bardole, Jim Bradford, Dick Gaglione (Chair), Elliott Greenberg, Mike Knoll, Kathy Weissman

- 1. The minutes of Executive Committee meeting, held at Reno, were approved.
- 2. An objection was raised against the request to pay one of the presenters at the Reno meeting. Such payment would be against the policies of the Division of Chemical Education. It was agreed that the Treasurer should write to each program Chair informing them that 2YC3 will not pay presenters. Any promises made will then be the responsibility of the program chair and not the 2YC3.
- 3. Elliot Greenberg distributed copies of the calendar of Jewish Holidays and urged the Executive Committee to avoid the scheduling of 2YC₃ meetings on these dates.
- 4. Dick Gaglione announced that:
 - . Leo Kling will chair the committee that will work the 2YC3 booth in the exhibit area at the Biennial Conference at Bozeman.
 - . He will secure a new Program Chair for the Denver meeting (95th conference) by the time of the Chicago meeting.
 - Ed Heath has submitted the names of presenters, titles and abstracts of each presentation for each paper to be given in the 2YC₃ portion of the Bozeman program.
- 5. It was also decided that the dates for the
 - 97th Conference at Lincoln, Nebraska should be October 9th and 10, 1987.
 - . 98th Conference at Jacksonville should be suggested for either November 20 and 21 or December 4 or 5, 1987.

Dick Gaglione will confirm these dates with John Kenkel (97th Conference) and Wendell Massey (98th Conference).

- 6. It was recommended that Dick Gaglione contact Allen Davis and Shalid Jalil of C3 to meet with the Executive Committee in Chicago to plan a program for the 100th conference in conjunction with ACS National at Toronto.
- 7. It was agreed that the Division of Chemical Education's 1988
 Biennial Conference at Purdue be co-sponsored by 2YC3 and listed
 as a fifth conference with no executive or open committee meetings.
 Doris Kolb will be the 2YC3 program chair for this conference which
 will now be listed as the 101st.
- 8. It was agreed that the past-chair will serve as an informal Parliamentarian to assist the Chair in the correct interpretation of the Policies and Procedures.
- 9. The results of the following elections were determined:
 - a. Mike Knoll was re-elected as Membership Chair
 - b. Ralph Burns was elected as Chair-elect for 1987.
- 10. Mike Knoll submitted lists of COCTYC members who had not paid their 2YC3 dues. Dick Gaglione indicated that he would contact these individuals.

It was agreed that the question of options in dues structure should be discussed at the Open Committee meeting.

11. Dick Gaglione announced that local two year college chemistry groups should be encouraged to submit their activities for inclusion as news items in our newsletter.

 Dick Gaglione opened the meeting at 9:30 A.M. and announced that Mike Knoll was reelected as Membership Chair and Ralph Burns was elected Chair-elect for 1987.

Dick also announced that $2YC_3$ was conducting a special 25th Anniversary Membership Drive and asked each committee member to participate by recruiting their colleagues. Special membership forms will appear in each edition of the Newsletter.

2. Pat Flath reported that everything was in order for the New York meeting and Dick Gaglione reported that pre-registration for the Chicago meeting was high and that Bill Mooney has put together a strong program featuring Mary Good, President-elect of ACS.

- 3. Mike Knoll reported a 1986 membership of 477, 383 of which are renewals. There are 108 1985 members who have not renewed.
- 4. The treasurer's report for 1985 showed an income of \$23,156.19 and debts of \$12,435.92, for a balance on December 31, 1985, of \$10,720.27.
 - Dick Gaglione encouraged everyone to make sure that their college is a 2YC3 sponsor.
- 5. Elliott Greenberg reported that 10 Industrial Sponsors have not renewed, while 4 are in limbo. There are 26 paid Industrial Sponsors. It was suggested that individuals such as Advisory Committee members at colleges be contacted and asked to recruit appropriate companies as Industrial Sponsors. It was also suggested that a list of current Industrial Sponsors be published.
- 6. Dick Gaglione reported that Leo Kling will be responsible for the booth at Bozeman and Ed Heath has arranged the $2YC_3$ program. Those planning to attend were requested to help out at the booth.
- Sam Crawford requested feedback on workshops that have been held and suggestions for workshops that members would like to have held.
- 8. Jim Bradford reported that
 - .. the Distillate has a new feature called the Public Understanding of Science, which he urged all teachers to share with as much of the public as possible.
 - .. the recommendations from the Invitational conference are being formulated into a report for distribution by funds supplied by $2YC_3$.
 - .. the results of a recently conducted survey will be presented in a paper on Tuesday at the ACS meeting.
 - .. the Chemical Technician booklet and brochure is ready for distrubution.
 - .. the SOCED Task Force, which is preparing guidelines for Two-Year College Chemistry, will meet on Monday, April 14, 1986.
 - $\cdot\cdot$ C3S is very active, since there are two large grants available for minority schools to fund consultant visits.

- 9. The question of dues structure including a lifetime membership option was discussed. The suggested amounts for lifetime memberships ranged from \$50 to \$100. Some expressed the concern that if \$6 per year memberships are difficult to sell, lifetime memberships would be much harder to market. Other concerns focused on whether IRS would accept this type of membership.
- 10. Dick Gaglione reported on the activities of the New Jersey Two Year College Chemistry Association and the San Francisco Bay Area 2YC3 local section. Announcements and reports of these meetings will appear in our Newsletter to encourage and support these groups. Other local groups were invited to send such information to Dick.
