#### 2YC3 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING 100th CONFERENCE Seneco College Wednesday June 1, 1988 Committee Room, President's Area

Members present: Jay Bardole, Edith Bartley, Ralph Burns, John Clevenger, Onofrio Gaglione, Elliott Greenberg, Leo Kling III, Mike Knoll, Duane Sell, Tamar Susskind

Guests present: Mark Amman, Rudolph Jones, Murray Morello

CALL TO ORDER: Ralph Burns, Chair, called the meeting to order at 3:0 pm.
Copies of the agenda and other materials had been sent to all executive committee members.

MINUTES: Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting for the 99th Conference (Sacramento, CA) were approved as printed in the Agenda Book, pages 1-5.

CONFERENCE REPORTS: The following conferences were discussed:
The 99th 2YC<sub>3</sub> at American River College, Sacramento, CA. Ralph
Burns summarized Dick Lungstrom's report of a successful and well run
conference. There were 185 participants from 19 states. There were
145 people registered for the banquet An additional 20 came to hear Dr.
Glenn T. Seaborg, Nobel Laureate, speak. Committee members expressed
thanks to Dick and all involved for an excellent conference.

The 100th 2YCz Seneca College, North York, Ont. Murray Morello distributed copies of an Interim Report and focused on some of the recommendations about joint Cz/2YCz conferences. Preregistration for the conference is excellent. The program looks outstanding.

#### TREASURER/COLLEGE SPONSORS REPORT:

Duane Sell referenced the report on page 10 in the agenda book and distributed an updated report for the period 3/11/88 to 5/31/88. To date there are 101 College Sponsors as shown on pages 11-15 of the agenda book. Duane also referenced the updated budget on page 9 which includes the Chair travel to Biennial meeting and increased income from Industrial Sponsors.

Duane said he has confirmed our tax-exempt status with the IRS and that our income is below that required to file each year. He also referenced the ACS tax-exempt status statement on pages 22-23 of the agenda book.

#### **MEMBERSHIP REPORT:**

Mike Knoll had sent a report, page 7 of the agenda book, showing 560 members as of 3/3/88.

#### INDUSTRIAL SPONSORS REPORT:

Leo Kling III explained that the Industrial Sponsors operate on a fiscal year and that there were 31 at this time.

#### **FUTURE MEETING SITES:**

John Clevenger referenced pages 17-20 of the agenda book showing future meetings. Planning for some of the meetings is well under way. There were concerns regarding the 104th in Irving, TX, the 108th in Boston, the 109th in Vancouver, BC, and the 11th Biennial in Atlanta. John will continue work on these.

ACS OFFICE OF TWO-YEAR COLLEGES REPORT:

Ralph Burns reported his understanding that Jim Bradford had a new appointment at ACS as Director of National Chemistry Week. Ralph understood that there would be a replacement for Jim's position regarding two-year colleges, but there had been no decision at this time.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

John Clevenger briefly described the proposal sent on behalf of COCTYC to the NSF Undergraduate Faculty Enhancement Program. If funded, this project would provide workshops for two-year college faculty in such areas as hazardous materials inventory, communication, and waste disposal. There was no additional information yet available about it's status.

Discussion was held regarding the possibility of a 2YC3 membership dues increase to \$10. This was in light of current and anticipated increased expenses, such as postal rate increases and colleges being more reluctant to pick up expenses for officers and conferences. A motion was passed to recommend to the general committee meeting that effective for the 102nd conference (Oct. 14-15, 1988 in Pittsburgh) dues and meeting registration be increased to \$10.00 (ten dollars).

Leo Kling III and Duane Sell initiated discussion on the concept of a Corporate Sponsors Sustaining Membership. The discussion focused on the need to present this to corporations as a request to fund specific projects, rather than just a general need for money. Discussions will be held at future meetings, with a proposal to be developed by Leo, Elliott, Duane, and John.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Ralph reminded everyone of the Conference Planning Workshop scheduled for the Kansas City, KS conference. Elliott will set-up and coordinate the sessions on Saturday afternoon and evening following the regular conference.

Uni distributed described and flyers about the Biennial Conference at Purdue and the Chemical Education: Software.

Ralph announced that Onofrio Gaglione was the national CMA award winner and that Edith Bartley, Margot Schum, and John Kenkel were regional winners.

ADJOURNMENT: The executive committee adjourned at 5:00 pm.

Committee on Chemistry in the Two-Year College Minutes of meeting at Toronto, Canada, June 4, 1988

The meeting was opened at 11:55 a.m. by Chair-elect John Clevenger who passed out agenda books, and introduced himself and the officers. Those present then introduced themselves and mentioned their college affiliation.

Duane Sell moved, and Margot Schumm seconded, that the minutes of the committee meeting at the Sacramento conference be approved as presented. Approved by voice vote, no dissension.

John Clevenger reported for Ralph Burns (who was attending the DIVCHED meeting) and summarized the highlights of the Sacramento conference. The highly successful meeting was climaxed by the banquet address given by Glenn Seaborg. The address was heard by about 185 people, including some 20-25 students who came after the banquet.

Dick Gaglione mentioned the history of 2YC3's very successful participation in the DIVCHED Biennial Meetings, starting at Storrs, Connecticut four years ago. Elliott Greenberg encouraged those present to attend this year's Biennial Conference at Purdue.

John Clevenger discussed the highlights of some upcoming conferences, including the themes and the names of persons involved. The next joint meeting with the Canadian Conference (C3) will be held at Vancouver, British Columbia in late May or early June of 1990. Dick Gaglione suggested including notice of C3 meetings in our newsletter, and Elliott Greenberg extended this to suggest that both organizations reciprocate in publishing notices of upcoming conferences. Persons interested in hosting or working on a future conference were encouraged to contact John Clevenger. Elliott Greenberg also offered to assist in receiving information about future conferences.

John Clevenger mentioned the membership report in the agenda book, followed by Duane Sell who reviewed the Treasurer's report and the budget adopted in Sacramento. The importance of College Sponsors to the organization was mentioned, and a request was made for each Committee member to check the list of Sponsors in the agenda book and make every effort to see that his or her college became a Sponsor, if not already listed. Rudolph Jones inquired as to what benefits College Sponsors receive and this was explained by Duane Sell.

Elliott Greenberg asked for the support of those present in recruiting new Industrial Sponsors. Muriel Kanter suggested that some sort of recognition be considered for companies that have been longtime Sponsors (10 years, 25 years, etc.).

John Clevenger mentioned that Jim Bradford (2YC3 liaison person at ACS) has been promoted to a new position but the name of his successor was not yet known. The importance of this position to 2YC3 was noted.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

It was reported that the Executive Committee discussed and suggested that all 1989 membership renewals, as well as registration fees for the upcoming Fall 1988 conferences, be increased to \$10. After a short discussion Duane Sell moved (seconded by Margot Schumm) that the new fee structure be adopted. Approved by unanimous voice vote.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Margot Schumm initiated discussion concerning the percentage of minority students that complete their studies, and the need for more minority women in science to serve as role models.

Some discussion ensued about the Committee membership in each region, the need to highlight the Vice-chairperson, and the need to check the responses to Jerry Bell's letters of appointment to see if it will be necessary for the Chairperson to replace any Committee members.

It was noted that there will be a Committee workshop at the conclusion of the Kansas City Conference to work on conference planning and establishing a committee structure that will promote greater participation of committee members in each region. Those present were invited to attend and/or provide input.
