COCTYC EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING
102nd CONFERENCE
Community College of Allegheny County
Thursday October 13, 1988
Days Inn Redwood, Pittsburgh, PA

Members present: Edith Bartley, Doug Bond, Ralph Burns, John Clevenger, Onofrio Gaglione, Elliott Greenberg, Duane Sell, Kathy Weissmann

Guests present: Cecil Hammonds

CALL TO ORDER: Ralph Burns, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:15pm. Copies of the agenda and other materials had been sent to all executive committee members.

MINUTES: Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting for the 100th Conference (Toronto) were approved as printed in the Agenda Book, pages 3-4.

CONFERENCE REPORTS: The following conferences were discussed:
DIVCHED Executive Committee and Task Force meeting in Los Angeles. Ralph Burns reported that he and John Clevenger had been at the DIVCHED Executive meeting in L.A. and that our attendance and his report had been well received. Ralph was complimented on the committee's work and the Newsletters. Ralph said that the Task Force is now working on supplementary materials for the guidelines and that Ron Archer (SOCED) was pleased with the Task Force's work. SOCED will fund an additional meeting of the Task Force in Washington, DC this December.

101st Conference with Biennial Conference, Purdue. Elliott Greenberg and Ralph Burns reported that the booth was a financial and public relations success. Elliott distributed a financial summary. We need to insure planning, staffing, and supplying the booth. A motion was passed unanimously that by the Kansas City meeting the Chair appoint a committee, with a representative from each region, to coordinate and setup the booth at the next Biennial in Atlanta.

The 102nd 2YC₃ Community College of Allegheny County. Barbara Rainard, Program Chair, was unable to attend because of her teaching schedule. Ralph Burns reported that, although the preregistration was low, the conference looked like a good one and more on-site registrations were expected.

TREASURER/COLLEGE SPONSORS REPORT:

Duane Sell referenced the report on page 9 in the agenda book, showing a good financial picture. To date there are 106 College Sponsors as shown on pages 12-17 of the agenda book. Since that listing he has received 6 more College Sponsors. Duane said these are all from the Northwest, and that he wished to send a letter of thanks to Bill Wasserman for his efforts in recruiting College Sponsors.

Duane reported that College Sponsor renewals are almost ready to mail. He has already had several inquiries about renewals. Next year he plans to mail the renewal forms earlier in the fall.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT:

Mike Knoll had sent a report, page 7 of the agenda book, showing 565 members as of 9/21/88. Duane Sell added that there were an additional 22 new members not shown from the meeting in Toronto.

INDUSTRIAL SPONSORS REPORT:

Ralph Burns reported that Leo Kling has moved and his new address was listed on the committee listing, page 31 of the agenda book. The current list of Industrial Sponsors is on pages 19-21 of the agenda book and is also listed in the current Newsletter.

FUTURE MEETING SITES:

John Clevenger referenced pages 23-26 of the agenda book showing future meetings. There was discussion about the location for the 108th conference in Boston and the date for the 109th conference in Vancouver.

After discussion of the difficulties of finding future meeting sites, program chairs, and local arrangements chairs, it was decided to reconstitute the meeting sites subcommittee. By the Kansas City meeting, Ralph will appoint one COCTYC member from each region to work with the Chair-Elect on this subcommittee.

ACS OFFICE OF TWO-YEAR COLLEGES REPORT:

Ralph Burns reported that Terri Nally was the new manager of the Office of College Chemistry at ACS. She was unable to attend this meeting, but plans to be in Kansas City. Her report is on page 27 of the agenda book.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES:

Ralph Burns reminded the committee that nominations for Chair-Elect 1990 are due by noon, Saturday, Oct. 15. He had also mailed to all members of the COCTYC an announcement of the Membership Chair position starting in 1990.

OLD BUSINESS:

John Clevenger reported that the proposal sent on behalf of COCTYC to the NSF Undergraduate Faculty Enhancement Program was not funded. He described the reviews, which indicated the proposal was not appropriate to that program. There was general discussion of the grants process at NSF and the role of COCTYC. Duane Sell agreed to pursue the idea of another COCTYC proposal to the Undergraduate Faculty Enhancement Program.

Duane Sell reported that there was no additional information on the concept of a Corporate Sponsors Sustaining Membership. He reminded the Committee of the need to present this to corporations as a request to fund specific projects, rather than just a general need for money. Discussions will be held at future meetings.

Elliott Greenberg reminded everyone of the Conference Planning Workshop scheduled for the Kansas City, KS conference. There will be a session on Saturday afternoon for future program and local arrangements chairs and an evening session for the executive committee. Elliott will set-up and coordinate these sessions. There was considerable discussion about the content of the evening session; particularly regarding conference planning, coordination and involvement of all members of COCTYC, and the possible need for a long-range planning group.

NEW BUSINESS:

Duane Sell distributed a preliminary budget for 1989. There was discussion of the amounts required for the Chair Travel to the ACS Fall meeting and the probable increases in costs for the Newsletter. Duane will submit a final budget in Kansas City.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Ralph Burns reported that several members of 2YC₃ are submitting articles for the special issue of The Journal of College Science Teaching on two-year colleges.

Onofrio Gaglione expressed thanks, for himself and on behalf of the committee, for the excellent job Ralph Burns has done as chair.

ADJOURNMENT: The executive committee adjourned at 11:30 pm.

CONFERENCE REPORTS: The following conferences were discussed:

John Clevenger described the successful 100th 2YC₃, Seneca College, North York, Ontario, Canada. It was a joint meeting with College Chemistry Canada, C₃, 6/1-4/88. It was followed by the 195th ACS National, part of the Chemical Congress of North America, 6/5-11/88.

DIVCHED Executive Committee and Task Force meeting in Los Angeles. Ralph Burns reported that he and John Clevenger had been at the DIVCHED Executive meeting in L.A. His report of our work and the Newsletters had been well received. Ralph said that the Task Force is now working on supplementary materials for the guidelines. SOCED is pleased with the Task Force's work and will fund an additional meeting of the Task Force in Washington, DC this December.

101st Conference with Biennial Conference, Purdue. Elliott Greenberg and Ralph Burns reported that the booth was a financial and public relations success and made many new contacts for 2YC₃. Ralph said there were many excellent presentations at the conference, including several from two-year colleges.

The 102nd 2YC₃ Community College of Allegheny County. Barbara Rainard reported that 33 people had registered and the meeting seemed to be off to a good beginning.



INTERIM REPORT, August, 1988
Ralph A. Burns, 1988 Chair

This report summarizes news information and conferences conducted by the Committee on Chemistry in the Two-Year Colleges (COCTYC) for the period January-August, 1988. The COCTYC has continued to support DivCHED and the improvement of chemical education by:

- Planning and promoting five Two-Year College Chemistry Conferences (2YC₃).
 1. The 99th 2YC₃, held March 11-12, 1988 at American River College, Sacramento, CA.
 2. The 100th 2YC₃ held jointly with the 15th C₃ (College Chemistry Canada), June 1-4 in Toronto at Seneca College, North York, Ontario.
 3. The 101st 2YC₃ held jointly with the Tenth Biennial Conference on Chemical Education, July 31-August 4 at Purdue University.
 4. The 102nd 2YC₃ to be held October 14-15, 1988 at the Community College of Allegheny County, Pittsburgh, PA.
 5. The 103rd 2YC₃ to be held November 18-19, 1988 at Kansas City Kansas Community College.

These conferences are spread across all regions of the country to allow for maximum participation at a minimal cost to those who attend.

- Continuing to support the ACS Office of College Chemistry in publishing the Distillate.
- Encouraging membership in the Division of Chemical Education and participation in its programs and activities.
- Participating in the Society Committee on Education (SOCED) Task Force on ACS Involvement in the Two-Year Colleges.
- Publishing four editions of the 2YC₃ Newsletter and distributing over 2000 copies of each edition to 2YC₃ members and to each two-year college. (These costs are being paid by the 1988 2YC₃ Chairman's college.)
- Providing information--through the 2YC₃ Newsletter--about current and future conferences, about publications such as the "Guidelines," about officers names and addresses, NSF deadlines, DivCHED membership, 2YC₃ membership, and other news items of general interest to the membership.
- Working to increase the number of 2YC₃ members, college sponsors, and industrial sponsors.

Election Information. At the Sacramento Conference, ballots were opened, and the announcement was made that the 1989 Chair-Elect is Elliott Greenberg of Prairie State College, Chicago Heights, IL. Jay Bardole of Vincennes Junior College, Vincennes, IN was elected to serve as member of the SOCED Task Force on ACS Involvement in Two-Year Colleges. Nominations for 1990 Chair-Elect must be received by the chair by Saturday, October 15, 1988.

Sacramento, California Conference. Some 180 participants took part in the 99th Conference, held March 11-12, 1988 at American River College in Sacramento, CA.

Dick Lungstrom, Conference Program Chair, and his colleagues at American River College had planned a varied and most interesting program. The opening address featured Dr. Victor T. Lee of the IBM-Almaden Research Center at San Jose, CA who described advances in the field of superconductors. A conference highlight came after the Friday evening banquet when Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg, Nobel Laureate and Chairman of the Lawrence Hall of Science at Berkeley, CA delivered an informative and most entertaining keynote address that summarized his work with "The Transuranium Elements." Another popular feature of the conference was a "Wine Component Seminar" conducted by personnel from a Napa Valley winery. Participants eagerly entered into some applied chemistry as they blended and tasted several important components of wines--all in the quest for better products for better living through chemistry. Conference participants heard information about instrumentation, and hazardous substances in the laboratory. Textbook authors Ken Whitten, Ed Peters, and Frank Carey discussed what lies ahead in textbooks. Also, William T. Mooney presented information regarding the ACS Guidelines and the Consultant Service for Chemistry and Chemical Technology Programs.

2YC₃ Reaches 100. In June, the 100th Conference was held jointly with C₃ (College Chemistry Canada) at Seneca College in Toronto. The four-day conference brought together approximately 200 participants from Canada and the U.S. There were excellent presentations by such persons as Clayton Callis, ACS President Elect, Irwin Talesnick, and Ronald Gillespie. There was also a good mix of U.S. and Canadian panalists who discussed critical issues in college chemistry. The elegant Friday evening banquet, held at the Ontario Science Centre, featured live classical music, awards, and an address. Dr. Murray Morello, Conference Chairperson, and his colleagues from Seneca College have set a standard of excellence that will be hard to surpass.

The 101st Conference. This conference was held jointly with The Tenth Biennial Conference on Chemical Education at Purdue University. The conference was well attended by two-year college faculty who also presented several papers and demonstrations. Biennial conferences allow for considerable interaction between and among teachers at the university, two-year college, and high school levels.

Future Meetings in 1988. The 102nd Conference will be held October 14-15 at the Community College of Allegheny County, Pittsburgh, PA with Barbara Rainard as Program Chair. The meeting will feature workshops and papers concerning "Developments in Learning Theory and Pre-College Education." The 103rd Conference will be held November 18-19 at Kansas City Kansas Community College with David W. Klein as Program Chair. The program theme is Lecture and Lab Demonstrations: Pro and Con. Presentations will be made by such persons as Clark Bricker, David Brooks, Wilbert Hutton, and William Robinson.

Conference Planning Workshop. Immediately following the afternoon presentations at the Kansas City Conference, all program chairs for future conferences are encouraged to stay for a late afternoon and evening workshop to be conducted by Elliott Greenberg and others. The workshop is being held to familiarize conference planners with details of planning good conferences.
