COCTYC Executive Meeting 108th Conference Days Inn - Lexington Massachusetts Thursday, April 19, 1990

Members Present: Onofrio (Dick) Gaglione, Elliott Greenberg, Richard Jones, Margot Schumm, Duane Sell

Guests: Mark Bollone, Dorothy Stumpf, Katherine Weissmann

Elliott Greenberg, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:20 P.M.

1. Approval of minutes of the Executive Committee meeting, 107th Conference

The minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held in Biloxi, Mississippi were approved as written (see Agenda Book pages 2-4).

11. Policies and Procedures

The ballots for the position of Chair Elect for 1991 were tallied. Ed Heath received the majority of votes. The Chair will notify the nominees of the election results.

III. Announcements

- A. Katherine Weissmann is the 1990 National two year college CMA award winner. The regional winners are; Western, Siegfried Lodwig, Midwestern, Milica Nedelson, Southern, Ann Cartwright, and Eastern, Don Berkowitz. Estelle Gearon and John Kenkel received OHAUS-NSTA awards for inovations in two-year college teaching.
- B. The The Chair has appointed an ad hoc Committee on Long Range Planning which will meet first to determine whether there is a need for such a committee. If so, the ad hoc committee will recruit additional members for the committee and hold an organizational meeting at the Biennial Conference in Atlanta

IV. Old Business

- A. Revision of Responsibilities for Executive Officers: The duties and responsibilities for the office of Secretary/Editor were discussed. Duane Sell suggested that there be an internship period for the person elected to the position of Secretary/Editor and that preparation of the Newsletter remain the responsibility of the Chair until the internship period is over. Several minor changes were made and the revised job description was approved.
- B. Review of applications for Secretary/Editor and Industrial Sponsor Chair Since very few applications for these positions had been received, it was decided to reopen the nomination period and extend it to October 1, 1990. The ballots will be prepared and mailed after the Elgin meeting and opened at the Mays Landing meeting in November.
- C. <u>Procedures for Advertisements in the Newsletter</u>: The guidelines governing the use of advertisements in the Newsletter, submitted by Leo Kling were approved. The problem of who would keep the records and manage the advertisements was discussed. Several suggestions were made and it was decided to create a new position, Assistant Industrial Sponsor Chair. The Assistant Industrial Sponsor Chair will keep the records needed for

managing the advertisements placed in the Newsletter. As a result of the discussion, it was agreed that it would probably not be possible to start running advertisements in the Newsletter by January 1, 1991, as it will take time to develop the procedures and to find the people to do the work.

C. Report from the Program and Local Arrangements Chair 108th Meeting: Dopothy Stumpf and Mark Bollone reported that all arrangements for the meeting were in order. The Committee expressed its appreciation for the effort that had gone into planning and implementing the program. Dorothy Stumpf expressed some concern about attendance at the meeting despite her efforts to contact as many people as possible. She suggested that the ACS National meeting may be drawing participants as well as Sponsors away from the 2YC₃ meeting. A discussion of participation at 2YC₃ meetings, in general, followed. Greater effort to publicize meetings such as, distributing preliminary programs for future meetings, especially in the same region, and announcing meetings in ACS calendar in C&EN, are needed.

U. New Business

- A. Change in Executive Committee Meeting Time: The day on which to hold Executive Committee meetings was discussed. Several people spoke in favor of moving the meetings to Saturday afternoon rather than Thursday evening. Some of the reasons given were; a. Less time lost at school, b. Easier for members traveling long distances, c. Air fares are cheaper from Thursday to Sunday and d. Opportunity to evaluate current meeting and possibly avoid same problems at the next meeting. It was decided try the new system and see how it works.
- B. Letter from Truman Schwartz Structure of COCTYC: A letter from Truman Schwartz, 1989 DIVCHED Chair, suggesting that COCTYC conform to the organizational pattern of other DIVCHED committees, was discussed. The Chair informed the group that Schwartz and other DIVCHED officers had been contacted and that the potential problem had been resolved. DIVCHED has legitimate concerns about the size of COCTYC. Problems could be minimized if COCTYC assumes responsibility for writing letters of commendation and gives committee members responsibilities that will justify the recognition they receive for having served on the committee. Elliott Greenberg suggested that the major problem may be one of semantics, that is, perhaps the Executive Committee should be called COCTYC. This would be more in keeping with other DIVCHED committees. The larger committee might then be called Regional Advisory Committees. Further discussion on this matter will be held at future meetings.
- C. Allocation of Funds for the 2YC₃ Booth at Biennial Meeting: Elliot reported that Leo Kling has suggested that 2YC₃ give sun visors with the 2YC₃ logo as souvenirs this year. There was unanimous support for this idea and \$500 was allocated to cover the cost.
- D. <u>Future Site Calendar</u>: It was decided not to rearrange the 1992–1993 calendar even though that means the Spring ACS and 2YC₃ meetings will not be held in the same city as is the custom. The Chair in 1993 will attend the Spring 1993 ACS National Meeting in addition to the 2YC₃ Spring meeting scheduled for Bloomington Minnesota. The Eastern site is still open for that year. There are other problems for 2YC₃ stemming from the schedule of future. Spring ACS meetings that will require further discussion.

The issue of whether or not to continue to have joint meetings with C_3 was discussed. A set of guidelines that had been prepared by Edith Bartley was approved to be used as a basis for discussion with the C_3 group at the Vancouver meeting. It was suggested that if another joint meeting is held, it be held at a Northern site in the U.S., possibly the 1993 Spring meeting which is to be in the East.

- E. NSF ILI Grants: Kathy Weissmann voiced concern about NSF awards to two-year colleges. It appears that though there is more money available, less is going to two year institutions. It was decided that the Chair and several other Executive Committee members meet with Bob Watson to discuss these concerns. It was also suggested that it might be necessary to become political. Before the Committee takes any action, we will check to see if ACS has a policy governing such matters.
- F. Expansion of Membership Services: Dick Jones distributed a revised Membership Application form and asked for comments. One major objective is to ascertain what services members need and want. Suggestions were made; a. Establish a clearing house of successful grant applications, b. Establish Regional Resource Centers and c. Look into the possibility of establishing an electronic Bulletin Board for members.

Duane Sell pointed out that there were over fifteen schools that been College Sponsors for 20 years or more. These institutions deserve recognition. A certificate acknowledging the length of the sponsorship has been sent to each College and the names of these institutions will be announced at the COCTYC meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:05 P. M.

Opening

Elliott Greenberg, Chair, opened the meeting at 9:35 A. M. He first introduced the officers and then asked those present to introduce themselves to the group.

Minutes

Richard Jones moved approval of the minutes of the meeting held at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College as presented in the Agenda Book on page 5. Dick Gaglione seconded the motion. The minutes were approved by voice vote.

Reports

The Chair referred the group to the Annual Report on page 7 of the Agenda Book.

The Chair reported that the Southern Regional meeting in Oulfsport Louisiana had been a SUCCESS.

Dorothy Stumpf, Program Chair, welcomed the group to Middlesex Community College.

The Treasurer, Duane Sell, reported on budget matters (details on page 4 of the Agenda Book) and the level of College Sponsorship; there are presently 104 college sponsors. He thanked the following institutions for their twenty or more years of continuous College Sponsorship.

The participants would develop laboratory exercises and then present similar workshops to others at subsequent regional meetings.

Elliott Greenberg asked for opinions on the feasibility of having $2YC_3$ meetings in those summers when no Biennial meeting is scheduled. A lively discussion ensued. When the matter was put to a vote, the group voted roughly 1/3 for, 1/3 against, having summer meetings.

Combined COCTYC and Executive Committee Meeting 109th Conference Capilano College, Vancouver, British Columbia Thursday, June 14, 1990

Present: Edith Bartley, Elliott Greenberg, Alan Kruse, Margot Schumm, Duane Sel∤, Carl Sheperd, Uni Susskind

The meeting was called to order at 2:10°P. M. by the Chair, Elliott Greenberg.

The Chair announced that in response to concerns expressed by the Chair of the Division of Chemical Education, it was decided that the Executive Committee of 2YC₃ will now be called The Committee on Chemistry in the Two-Year College, COCTYC, and regional members of COCTYC will now be members of the **2YC₃ Regional Advisory Boards**. In the future, the 2YC₃ Chair will send letters of appointment to the newly appointed Advisory Board members. This year, during the transition stage, the DIVCHED chair made one year appointments. Next year, the 2YC₃ Chair can extend these appointments for an additional two years.

The next step will be to examine the Policies and Procedures to see whether any changes are necessary. It was also felt that the duties of the Regional Advisory Boards should be more clearly described. Recommendations are being sought.

- II. The consensus among the members present was in favor of continuing the policy of holding joint C₃/2YC₃ meetings every other year. Those present agreed with the decision made in Boston, that these meetings take place in odd numbered years so as not to be held the same summer as the Biennial Conference on Chemical Education. It was decided to explore the possibility of having the next joint meeting in Rhode Island in June of 1993 and to appoint a 2YC₃ member to act as liaison to the C₃ group.
- III. Volunteers are still being sought to fill three positions, Industrial Sponsors Chair, Assistant Industrial Sponsors Chair and Secretary/Editor. However, not everyone in the group was convinced of the need for a Secretary/Editor.
- ID. The need for help in securing grant money for two year schools was discussed. Members of the Executive Committee who will be in Washington D. C. for the National ACS meeting in August 1990, will try to meet with persons in positions of influence in ACS, NSF and Congress to ask for their help in obtaining aid and support for chemistry programs in two year colleges. It was suggested that the ILI grants may not be an appropriate source of funds for two year colleges, especially for smaller schools that may not be able to obtain matching funds. Concern at having lost an advocate at NSF with the departure of Bassam Shakashiri was expressed.
- The role of SOCED was discussed. It was decided to ask Terry Nally and Uni Susskind to make a presentation at the Elgin meeting in October describing the ACS position paper on education, SOCED's role in its formulation and the paper's impact on the two year colleges

The meeting was adjourned at 3:40 P. M.

INTERIM REPORT, August, 1990 Elliott Greenberg, 1990 Chair

This report briefly summarizes news information and conferences conducted by the Committee on Chemistry in the Two-Year College (COCTYC) for the period January-August, 1990.

Conferences. Our main activity continues to be the enhancement of chemical education and professional development for faculty through presentations and workshops at our conferences. The two Spring conferences at Bedford, MA (just prior to the ACS Meeting) and at Vancouver, B.C. (joint with College Chemistry Canada) were most successful. Combined total attendance at these two conferences was approximately three hundred. We also participated in the Biennial with a booth in the exhibit area, and a program for two year college faculty. An important activity at our conferences this year is the inclusion of workshops on writing grant proposals. We are looking forward to two excellent Fall conferences at Elgin, IL (October 5-6, 1990) and Mays Landing, NJ (November 16-17, 1990).

Administrative Changes. In order to conform to the size and structure of other committees of the Division, it has been decided to make some nomenclature changes with regard to the Committee on Chemistry in the Two-Year College. Henceforth, the Executive Committee will be known as the COCTYC, and the approximately 60-70 members of the "Committee" will be referred to as the 2YC3 Advisory Board, with regional designations. In order to assist the Chair and Secretary of the Division, appointments to the Advisory Board will now be made directly by the Chair of the COCTYC. In all other respects the operation of the COCTYC and our conferences will continue as in the past.

Election Information. Ed Heath of Southwest Texas Junior College, Uvalde, TX, has been elected to serve as Chair-Elect of the COCTYC for 1991, and will be Chairperson in 1992. We are currently asking for inquiries and nominations for Chair-Elect in 1992, and the positions of Secretary/Editor, Industrial Sponsors Chair, and Assistant Industrial Sponsors Chair.

Continuing Activities. We continue to publish four editions of the 2YC₃ Newsletter each year, distributing over 2000 copies to members and to each two-year college. Efforts are being made to increase the involvement of 2YC₃ members in the planning and execution of conferences, as well as the solicitation of new members and College and Industrial Sponsors. In order to maintain a continued high level of quality at our conferences, we continue to conduct informal workshops on conference planning to assist those persons involved in conducting future conferences.
