Duane indicated the advantages of college sponsorship, and solicited new Sponsors from those whose college was not listed as a Sponsor.

Call to Order

Ed Heath called the meeting to order at 4:30 PM.

Approval of COCTYC Meeting - 117th Conference

The following correction was made in the minutes; the Retreat will be May 28 - 30, not March 28 - 30. With this corrected, the minutes of the 117th COCTYC meeting at the College of Marin were approved by voice vote.

Summary Report of the 118th Conference

Joe Maguire reported that approximately 140 people registered for the meeting. He was a little disappointed that there were not more Michigan community college people present. He mentioned that it was hard to run workshops and papers concurrently. He feels it dilutes the audience for both. He also commented on running a meeting on time. Speakers and organizers should start on time.

Personnel Matters - Ed Heath

Wendell Massey of Florida Community College - Kent Center, Jacksonville, Florida was elected to the Chair - Elect position for 1993 and the Chair position for 1994.

~~DIVCHED~~ COCTYC Task Force - Ed Heath

Ed asked COCTYC for permission to appoint two Task Forces:

1 - Improving Minority Participation in 2YC₃ - The Task Force will address how the community college accommodates the needs of minority students and returning older students or students that are not the traditional four year college and university student, and prepare specific activities to inform the chemical education community with respect to these subjects through the 2YC₃ conference programs, beginning in the calendar year 1993. The Chair will ask Edith Bartley of Tarrant County Junior College - South Campus, Fort Worth, Texas, to head this Task Force.

2 - Two Year College Faculty-Industrial Interface - The Task Force will develop a project co-sponsored by 2YC₃ and a group of specific volunteer industries, such as Dow Corning, where members will apply for summer spring or fall positions. They will define actions that will lead to the implementation of such an effort. The Chair will ask Joan Sabourin of Delta College in Michigan to head this Task Force.

Both Task Forces will submit in writing to the Chair of COCTYC suggestions for specific 2YC₃ activities to implement their charge. The Chair of COCTYC will then present it to the Executive Committee for final approval. The Deadline for the report is the last fall meeting of 1992.

Old Business

Duane Sell talked about the Task Force on General Chemistry that he is the liaison for COCTYC. He said that John Spencer from Franklin and Marshall College is submitting an NSF proposal to form a National Center for Research in General Chemistry Education involving universities, four year colleges and two year college. He is proposing that there be four regional centers, with the Director at Franklin and Marshall - representing the four year colleges, an Associate Director at Purdue University - representing the universities, Prairie View A & I in Texas representing minority colleges and a community college to be named later. Discussion followed.

Dave Klein talked about the ACS moving the Spring 1996 ACS meeting from Seattle to New Orleans. This has produced some changes in the conference sites and dates. Shoreline Community College of Seattle, Washington has requested the 136th meeting for the late spring time frame of 1996. This would necessitate the following changes, we will try to put a meeting in New Orleans (Southern Site) in the early spring time frame of 1996, that would require 2YC₃ to have its late fall 1995 meeting at an Eastern site - preferably in the "southern" part of the Eastern region

New Business


A letter was received from Daphne Figueroa and Tammy Terhune of San Diego Miramar College concerning the 117th conference at the College of Marin; discussion followed.

Elliott Greenberg brought up that American Chemical Society has now permitted issuing continuing educational units (CEU) by universities for workshops. He stated that a Task Force is being appointed to offer CEU in general for workshops. He wanted to be sure that a 2YC₃ person is appointed. Ed Heath responded that Don Jones said there would be a 2YC₃ person on the Task Force.
