2YC₃ Western Regional Advisory Board Meeting 121st Conference Mt. Hood Community College Gresham, Oregon Friday, November 13, 1992

ATTENDANCE:

Twenty one names were listed on the attendance sheet. Three were Regional Advisory Board members.

OPENING:

The meeting was opened at 9:30 a.m. by the Chair, Ed Heath.

INTRODUCTIONS:

All members of the audience introduced themselves, the college or high school they represented and if they were COCTYC officers or past officers.

MINUTES:

The minutes of the 119th Southern Regional Advisory Board meeting held at Amarillo College were approved by voice vote.

REPORTS:

A. 120th Conference

Dave Klein presented a report on the 120th Conference held at Amarillo College, Amarillo, Texas. There were 97 people in attendance for the conference. Jerry Foster, Program Chair, was very satisfied with the conference. Jerry and his staff were commended for their efforts.

B. Treasurer's Report

In the absence of the Treasurer, Ed Heath presented the Financial Report as provided in the agenda book.

C. College Sponsors

In the absence of the College Sponsors' Chair, Dick Jones reported that as of November 1, 1992, there were 141 college sponsors - an all time high.

D. Membership

Dick Jones reported that as of November 10, 1992, there were 696 2YC3 members. With the registrants of this conference (121st), 2YC3 membership will go over 700, this is an all time high for 2YC3.

E. Industrial Sponsors

In the absence of the Industrial Sponsors' Chair, Ed Heath reported that as of November 1, 1992, there were 21 Industrial Sponsors.

F. Future Meeting Site

Dave Klein reported that Monroe Community College in Rochester, New York was considering hosting the 129th Conference during the early fall time frame of 1994.

OLD BUSINESS:

Ed Heath talked about the retreat for COCTYC members and past chairs that was held in late May 1992, in St. Louis, Missouri. The final results of the reorganization that resulted from this meeting, will be presented to the member of the organization during the 1993 calendar year.

NEW BUSINESS:

John Clevenger reported on the workshop for the Role of Professional Societies in Two Year College Science, Mathematics and Engineering Education that was held in Washington, D.C. on October 29-30, 1992. John mentioned that 2YC3 was singled out as a possible model for new organizations that might spring up.

Terri Nally from the Office of College Education, American Chemical Society, talked about the products that her office has available. Some of those products are the Guidelines for Chemistry and Chemical Technology Programs in the Two Year College (this information is given to local, state and federal governments), the college chemistry consultant program, ACS official policy statement on the two year college, Chemunity News publication that comes out five times a year that focus on the ACS education division programs, the Student Affiliate Program of the ACS and the paper for local ACS section on how to incorporate two year colleges into conferences.

Bill Wasserman, the 2YC3 representative to the Task Force of General Chemistry Education, reported on the Task Force explaining that four people from different regions of the country and different types of institutions will be in charge. The head is Jim Spencer from Franklin & Marshall College. The Task Force is waiting for funding which they hope will be available by the first of the year (93). Once funding is available sites will be chosen to test the materials that are being developed. Two programs being developed are the laboratory based approach and the modular approach.

ANNOUNCEMENT:

Dick Jones announced that the second year of the NSF Funded Summer Workshop on instrumentation will be run this coming summer at the University of Dayton. This grant was the result of active cooperation between 2YC3 members and University of Dayton.

Late arriving people were asked to introduce themselves.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 a.m.
