NSF Grants:


David Klein reported on the guide for writing NSF grants which is available.

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 1:05 pm by the
Chair, Wendell Massey.

127th CONFERENCE:

John Mangini, Program Chair, and Pat Nichols, Local
Arrangements Chair, both from Metropolitan Community College
were present to discuss their experiences with the
conference. A total of 32-34 people attended the
conference. Themes for futures conferences and ways to
increase attendance were discussed. It was suggested that
curricula changes and demonstrations were popular topics.
For future conferences, regional groups, including local
high schools, and the local ACS section should be utilized
to increase attendance.

MINUTES OF THE 126TH CONFERENCE:

Under Old Business, 13th Biennial, the minutes were
corrected to read that Michaelleen P. Lee was appointed to
represent 2YC3 at the 13th Biennial, rather than Carol
White. The minutes were approved as corrected.

PERSONNEL MATTERS:

The committee considered the candidacy of Jeffery
Cramer; he was elected Treasurer for a three-year term
starting January 1, 1995. Duane Sell will serve as
Treasurer until that time.

FUTURE SITES:

David Klein reported that the 131st Conference, in
conjunction with the 1995-ACS National Meeting, Anaheim,
will be at Mt. San Antonio College, Walnut, California.
Wendell Massey reported that the 135th Conference will be at
Delgado Community College in New Orleans. Jeff Smith is the
contact person at Delgado. Responding to an invitation from
C3 of Canada, it was decided that the 141st Conference will
be a joint meeting with C3 to be held in June of 1997. The
location for the meeting will be Sir Wilfred Grenfell
College in Cornerbrook, Newfoundland. Wendell Massey will
write to accept the invitation from C3.

BUDGET REPORT:

The budget report prepared by Duane Sell was reviewed.

COLLEGE SPONSORS:

Active college sponsors are listed in the agenda book. Everyone was urged to have his/her school become a sponsor.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT:

Dick Jones presented the membership report, and suggested that he send 2YC3 Brochures, College Sponsorship Applications, and a letter concerning the benefits of membership to all Regional Chairs. The Regional Chairs are to send out this information to instructors in their region. The committee approved his suggestion.

INDUSTRIAL SPONSORS:

Margot Schumm suggested ways to increase interaction with industrial sponsors at the conferences. Exhibitors could give out raffle tickets using prizes donated locally as was done at the Amarillo conference.

NEWSLETTER INFORMATION:

Robert Kirkley has requested information and articles for the 94-III Newsletter by June 10, 1994. Dick Jones suggested, and it was approved, that a call for data concerning transfer students from two-year schools to four-year schools be included in the next Newsletter. This information should be sent to Margot Schumm.

OLD BUSINESS

13th Biennial: Margot Schumm reported on the plans for the 13th Biennial Conference. Michaelleen P. Lee of Bucks County Community College is the representative for 2YC3. 2YC3 will have a booth, and participate in a symposium discussing the four-year student versus the two-year transfer student in obtaining the baccalaureate degree. Carol White is the representative for the 14th Biennial Conference to be held at Clemson University. The Newsletter will continue to provide information concerning these conferences.

James Sells' Letter: James Sells has give written permission to publish his letter concerning the Ford Foundation study in the Newsletter.

DivCHED-COCTYC: Margot Schumm presented the importance of having a member of COCTYC as a voting member of DivCHED. Dave Klein provided a letter containing arguments in favor of this change in procedure. Wendell Massey is to send a letter, including a copy of Dave Klein's letter, to nineteen individuals listed by Margot Schumm. Both Margot and Wendell will contact these people by phone, in addition to the letter.

COCTYC Flow Chart: The flow chart prepared by Margot Schumm and distributed at the 126th Conference is to be included with the letter indicated above, that Wendell Massey will prepare and send out prior to the National ACS meeting in the Fall of 1994.

Regional Advisory Board Members: New Regional Advisory Board Chairs were appointed as follows: Western Region-William Wasserman; Southern Region-Dale Buck; Eastern Region-Onofrio Gaglione; Midwestern Region-no change. David Klein will notify each of these individuals; included in his letter will be comments concerning what is expected of them as Chairs, the size of the Regional Boards (8-12), and a request for advice.

NEW BUSINESS


Newsletter: Robert Kirkley is to obtain bids for printing of the Newsletters. The bids should apply to Newsletters of from 12-20 pages.
