#### ATTENDANCE:

There were twenty-three people in attendance including the following COCTYC members:

#### **OPENING:**

The Meeting was opened at 9:10 A. M. by the Chair, Wendell Massey.

#### **INTRODUCTIONS:**

The officers of COCTYC, Advisory Board Members, and others present introduced themselves.

#### MINUTES OF THE 129TH REGIONAL ADVISORY BOARD MEETING:

The minutes of the 129th Regional Advisory Board Meeting were read and corrected to include Carol White's name as a member of the COCTYC present. The minutes were approved as amended.

#### REPORTS:

Monroe Community College Conference:

Wendell Massey reported on the 129th Conference that was held October 7-8, 1994, in Rochester, New York. He reported that 111 people were in attendance, and there were many interesting talks, including one by Nobel Laureate, Dr. Roald Hoffmann.

#### Treasurer's Report:

In the absence of the Treasurer, Duane Sell, Wendell Massey provided the treasurer's report. It appears on page 8 of the Agenda Book for the 130th Conference.

#### College Sponsors:

Wendell Massey also provided the report on college sponsors. The list of sponsors is shown on pages 9-15 of the Agenda Book; the total is 120.

#### Membership:

Dick Jones reported there are currently 510 members as of 11/17/94, but that he expects approximately 600 by the end of the calendar year. Membership renewal forms will be mailed out this month. Dick also reported on NSF funding for instrumentation workshops for Summer 1995.

#### **Industrial Sponsors:**

Carol White reported a total of 16 industrial sponsors. A listing is found on page 19 of the Agenda Book. Carol urged everyone to visit the exhibit area during the conference. For \$100.00 per year, and industrial sponsor can exhibit at all four of the Regional 2YC<sub>3</sub> Conferences each year. Sponsors can also place ads in the NewSletter of the organization.

#### **Future Sites:**

Dave Klein reported on future meeting sites. Planning for new sites is done three years in advance. The Conference Summary Calendar is found on page 20.

Ann Cartwright urged everyone to attend the 131st Conference at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, California, that will be held in conjunction with the national ACS spring meeting. Jeff Cramer, of Stark Technical College provided information about the 132nd Conference, which is to be held at his college in Canton, Ohio

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS AND NEW BUSINESS

#### 13th Biennial Conference:

Carol White reported on the 13th Biennial Conference held at Bucknell University July 31-August 4, 1994. Her report included details of the symposium concerning the Ford Foundation Study of two-year colleges versus four-year colleges. She also reported on the 14th Biennial Conference which will be held at Clemson University. Their theme is "Chemistry, The Challenge of Change."

#### DivCHED:

Wendell Massey reported on the need for 2YC<sub>3</sub> to have greater input in DivCHED. Dave Klein listed some of the benefits of 2YC<sub>3</sub> to its membership, such as representing the membership in Washington to influence ACS. An example of this is that people from two-year colleges now help prepare the ACS exams.

#### 2YC<sub>3</sub> Concerns:

Wendell Massey initiated a discussion concerning ways to improve conferences and attendance at conferences. The discussion included such topics as site location, program themes directed at teaching, number of conferences per year, and early printing of the program in the Newsletter.

Wendell Massey thanked Peter Golden, from Isothermal Community College for the excellent conference. Approximately 75 people attended the conference. Peter had acted not only as the Program Chair, but also the Local Arrangements Chair and Exhibit Coordinator.

#### MINUTES OF THE 129TH CONFERENCE:

The minutes were corrected for the spelling of Jeffrey Cramer's name. "Jeffery" was changed to "Jeffrey". The minutes were approved as corrected.

#### PERSONNEL MATTERS:

Wendell Massey had previously contacted all members of the COCTYC concerning the death of Ed Heath, Past Chair. Wendell reported that flowers were sent to the funeral in the name of the COCTYC, and that he would write an obituary which will appear in Volume 95-I of the Newsletter. Margot Schumm was appointed to complete the unexpired term of Ed Heath as Past Chair.

#### **FUTURE SITES:**

David Klein reported on future sites. He reported difficulty contacting DuPage College, Chicago, Illinois, concerning the 138th Conference in the Fall of 1996. Approval of DuPage College will not be finalized until their proposed dates in September are acceptable to the committee.

#### **COLLEGE SPONSORS:**

The listing of the College Sponsors is found on pages 9-15 in the Agenda Book for the 130th Conference. An application for college sponsorship is found on page 16.

#### MEMBERSHIP REPORT:

Dick Jones reported there were 510 members as of November 17, 1994, and he expects 550 by the end of the year.

#### **INDUSTRIAL SPONSORS:**

Carol White reported there are currently 16 industrial sponsors, down from 22 last year. She reported that records from the Rochester Conference have not been received concerning the exhibitors.

#### **NEWSLETTER INFORMATION**:

The deadline for submission of material for the 95-I Newsletter is December 15, 1994.

#### **VOTING MEMBERSHIP ON DivCHED:**

It was decided that the Chair should draft a letter concerning ex-officio voting status to DivCHED which will be presented at the Spring ACS meeting.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Regional Advisory Boards: Discussion of the Regional Advisory Board Members, their duties and involvement in the organization was deferred until the Leadership Conference in July, 1995. (See New Business).

Conference Concerns: Dave Klein reported on the need for a check list for the conference mentors. Dave will prepare the list for the program chairs. Wendell will prepare the list the local arrangements. Carol White will prepare the list for the exhibit coordinators. All of these check lists are to be sent to Dick Jones.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Budget: The budget for 1995 was approved as amended. Conference Consulting was increased to \$2000.00. Expenses will include \$5000.00 for a leadership conference. It was also decided to establish an Ed Heath Memorial Fund for Membership Activities. An announcement of this fund will appear in the Newsletter.

Two-Year College Base-Line Study: It was decided to title the draft, prepared by Margot Schumm, et al., a "White Paper". This draft will be used to ask approval for a go ahead from ACS.

Leadership Conference: It was decided to have a Leadership Conference July 21-22, 1995, in Houston, Texas. The Conference is to begin by 1:00 P. M. Friday, July 21st. Ann Cartwright and Robert Kirkley will make the local arrangements.

#### ADJOURNMENT:

The meeting adjourned at 6:30 P. M.
