Rick Bolesta called the meeting to order, at Diablo Valley College, at 10:45 AM.

- A. Rick noted that the minutes for the 150th 2YC₃ Conference held at Westark College, Fort Smith, AR, held November 4-5, 1999, are found on page 2 of the agenda book.
- B. Rick Bolesta explained the role of the COCTYC and the goals of the 2YC₃.

III. Reports

- A. Tom Gruber reported on the 150th 2YC₃ Conference held at Westark College. The theme was Microscale Chemistry. The program chair, Thomas Clark, scheduled microscale chemistry workshops at the high school and college level. Presenters compared micro and small scale experiments. Other presentations included Instructional Tutorials for Chemical Instrumentation and Computer Animations of Chemical Reactions. Dr. Mono M. Singh, National Microscale Chemistry Center, Merrimack College, was the banquet speaker.
- B. Treasurer's Report. Jeff Cramer, Tresurer, gave his report. Our net income as of March 24, 2000, is \$12,689.54. This includes all savings and reserves. Next year's budget was presented showing a loss of \$4650.00. Budget loss may be misleading since the actual travel costs tend to be less than budgeted.
- C. College Sponsors. Jeff Cramer reported there are 120 college sponsors of the 2YC₃. There are approximately 29 college sponsors that will receive a plaque recognizing their 25 years of sponsorship.
- D. Membership. Delores Aquino reported there were 413 2YC₃ members for 1999. Combined membership for DivCHED and 2YC₃ is \$25.00. Individual membership is \$15.00 for each.


