Lodging and Transportation

San Diego City College is located at the southwest corner of Balboa Park, in the very heart of the city (it's that big green rectangle you'll find on every map). The airport is just 2 miles to the west and north, on the edge of San Diego Bay; the central bus and Amtrak terminals are 1 mile directly west. The national meeting of the American Chemical Society is scheduled immediately after ours, at the Convention Center on the bayfront just 1 mile to the southwest, an easy trolley ride from the City College stop.

We've chosen an "inner ring" of small hotels, all within easy walking distance of City College, as priority conference lodgings. Consider the epicenter (a uniquely California term to denote "where the shakin' is") to be the corner of 9^{th} Avenue and Ash Street – all lodgings are within a block or two of this point. The conference site itself is the City College Technology Education Center (TEC) building, on 12^{th} avenue where A Street runs into the campus.

City Bus #992, "the Flyer," runs to and from the airport from its terminus at the corner of 9^{th} and A Street (one block south of Ash) every 10-15 minutes. Transit time is about 25 minutes, cost is 2 dollars. Other airport transportation options abound, with shuttle and taxi services providing 10 minute transit times for 5-7 dollars.

To drive from the airport/car rental locations, head south for about a mile on North Harbor Drive, turn left on Broadway, left on 9^{th} Avenue, and four blocks north to the hotel area.




