


Thesaurus: ProQuest

The ProQuest Thesaurus is an easy way to identify other keywords and terminology that pertain to your topic. This will help you to either narrow or expand your topic as needed.

- From the main ARCC homepage, locate the link for library.
- Select Coon Rapids Campus.
- Under the Databases heading, select PROQUEST.
- ProQuest opens to a basic search screen. Select Advanced Search at the upper left of the page.
- Select Thesaurus at the far right of the Advanced Search page.
